

Remembering St Peter St Joan of ARC: WHAT IS A LEGACY GIFT?

Last month, the SPSJOA Legacy Society was introduced as a unified recognition program of legacy gifts for all parishioners of our new parish, St Peter St Joan of Arc.

Parishioners who provide a legacy gift to the parish and notify the parish of such gifts become members of the Society. But, what is a legacy gift? Simply stated, a legacy gift describes the donor's commitment to transfer a portion of the donor's accumulated wealth to a gualified religious, educational, or charitable organization at the time of the donor's death. For our purpose, this would be a gift to the parish from a parishioner's estate. A legacy gift is generally made by means of a formal instrument which might include a will, trust, insurance policy, retirement plan, gift annuity, or donor-advised fund.

Legacy planning is not a "fundraising" program, but rather it is faith-based in discipleship and stewardship. As we mature in our discipleship, we recognize our mission to pass our faith onto future generations. We do this through evangelization - knowing and understanding our faith well and sharing that faith with others. Just as important, as disciples of Christ, we must recognize and be grateful for all the glorious gifts that have been provided to us during our lifetimes. As grateful disciples, we return a portion of the gifts we have accumulated over our lifetimes to our parish and other charitable organizations. Such important gifts will touch the lives that come after us and build our faith for generations to come.

Wealth is not a requirement for legacy giving. All grateful disciples have some means to share a portion of accumulated assets regardless of their size.

If any parishioner has already provided a gift to either St Peter or St Joan of Arc but the parish has not been notified, please contact Stephanie Grieser, Director of Stewardship so that you can be added to the SPSJOA Legacy Society. Also, contact Stephanie if you would like more information on legacy planning (sgrieser@stjoanofarcpowell.org or by telephone at either campus office).


THE LITURGY OF THE WORD




