We are blessed to have a religious sister working in our parish supporting the Family Catechesis program. Below is some interesting information about Sr. Monika. Please

welcome her to our parish.

Hi, my name is Sister Monika. I grew up in Germany as the oldest of seven children. My parents taught us to pray and attend Mass from an early age. When I was about ten years old our youth group organized a consecration to our Blessed Mother Mary which led me to a personal prayer life; as a teenager I started to go to daily Mass, and I felt called to religious life at the age of 17. I studied French and Latin in college and joined the Apostolic Sisters of Saint John in 2001 in France. Since 2010 I have served in various ministries in New Jersey, Illinois, and Columbus (mainly faith formation and retreats for children, teens, and adults, but also prison ministry, visits to the sick and elderly, etc.).

Faithful Citizenship: Dignity of the Human Person

In Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the U.S. identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching—Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity—and apply them to concrete issues. This is not to tell the faithful for whom or against whom to vote but to provide a foundation for Catholics to better evaluate policies, platforms, and candidates in light of the Gospel and the Church's moral and social teaching. This entry focuses on the Dignity of the Human Person.



Because each human person is created in the image and likeness of God, each one of us possesses innate and inviolable human dignity. This dignity is present in each person from the moment of their conception and throughout their lives. As Pope Francis has emphasized, human dignity is central to building a society where we are "brothers and sisters all" (*Fratelli Tutti*, no. 8).

We engage in the public square with a foundation of human dignity that:


- Protects the most vulnerable—children in the womb who are in danger of abortion—while also standing in radical solidarity with mothers.¹
- Upholds the dignity of the elderly, disabled, or ill by strongly rejecting euthanasia and assisted suicide.
- Recognizes migrants and refugees through immigration reform that respects human dignity, provides a path to citizenship, and addresses the root causes of migration.
- Supports the dignity of the person, created male or female, and opposes an ideology that denies the difference and reciprocity between man and woman.²
- Overcomes racism in our hearts as well as in our systems and institutions, which denies that we are all equally made in the image of God.³
- Continues seeking reform of the criminal justice system, ends the use of the death penalty, and supports measures to reduce the threat of gun violence.⁴

Through our political participation, accompaniment of those in need, and the witness of our daily lives, may we support the dignity of every person created in God's image.



SPSJOA Community Festival

Thank you to everyone who stopped by the STO tent at our Community Festival to chat and drop off bags of food! We collected **4 large wagonloads** of canned goods for our food pantries over three days at the Festival, and a large overflow of food in our Narthex collection box.

233 meals	Street Ministry	Our Street Ministry served hot meals and bagged lunches to approximately 233 individuals living on the streets of Columbus in the month of August.
200 bagged lunches	Open Shelter Ministry	200 bag lunches were made at Saint Peter in August for The Open Shelter.
9 crates	Sandwich Collection	9 crates of sandwiches were collected in August for Saint Joseph's Cathedral.
59 units	Bloodmobile	The Bloodmobile at Saint Peter collected 59 units during the August 19 blood drive. The next blood drive will take place Monday, October 14 at Saint Peter Campus.
6 families	St. Vincent de Paul	St. Vincent de Paul assisted 6 families with rent and food assistance in August.
2 carloads, 19 boxes, and 26 crates	Weekly Food Pantry Collection	 2 carloads of food were sent to Help My Neighbor food pantry, and 1 carload was sent to St. John food pantry from Saint Peter Campus in August. This food helped serve 217 households at St. John. 19 boxes of food, household, personal hygiene and cleaning supplies from Saint Joan of Arc Campus were sent to J.O.I.N. in August. 26 crates of food from Saint Joan of Arc Campus were sent to Help My Neighbor food pantry in August.
