FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



On September 29, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Archangels: Saint Michael, Saint Gabriel, and Saint Raphael. Though there are countless angels in heaven, the Bible mentions these three specifically. It is good to befriend such powerful intercessors and to call upon the archangels frequently. Our parish has the wonderful custom of ending each Mass with a short prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel.

The Catholic Church also celebrates the Feast of the Guardian Angels on October 2. God has paired every person with an angel. It is helpful to keep our guardian angels' presence in mind, especially during difficulties or times of loneliness. Our guardian angels pray for us, protect us, and help us respond to God's grace. In the morning, consider greeting your angel with this timeless prayer: "Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me hear, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide."

Switching subjects, let me draw your attention to our Stewardship of Time Campaign. Many of us face tremendous demands on our time. It takes a conscious effort to make time for our faith. Participating in the Stewardship of Time Campaign is an exercise in reevaluating our values and priorities which determine how we spend our time. I sincerely thank everyone who has prayerfully made a commitment to giving time back to God. May the Holy Spirit continue to strengthen us to say "Yes" to activities on our calendar that are most meaningful to our spiritual growth.

Lastly, please pray for a successful and safe March for Life that will take place at noon this Friday, October 4, at the Ohio Statehouse. There will be several events downtown that day, including Mass with Bishop Fernandes at 9:00 a.m. at Saint Joseph Cathedral and a Rally at 11:00 a.m. on the Statehouse grounds. The theme for this year's march is "With Every Woman, For Every Child." As Catholics, we are indeed committed to supporting every woman facing a difficult pregnancy. We are also committed to promoting the dignity of every child, even those who have yet to be born.

Faithful Citizenship: Solidarity

In Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the U.S. identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching—Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity—and apply them to concrete issues. This entry focuses on Solidarity.



Solidarity is "a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to . . . the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all."¹ We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Human beings are social in nature; we develop and flourish within a community. As baptized members of the community of the Church, we are part of one body in Christ and one global human family.²

Solidarity requires that in our prayer and in our political engagement, those who are weak, vulnerable, and most in need receive preferential concern. We are called to practice "radical solidarity" by:

- Accompanying women to choose life and supporting new mothers and their children.³
- Advocating for families and individuals affected by poverty, unemployment, sickness, mental illness, addiction, the elderly, and those with disabilities.
- Aiding victims of war and supporting peace initiatives, particularly in Ukraine, West Africa, and the Middle East.⁴
- Seeking policies that "welcome, protect, promote, and integrate" migrants and refugees who arrive at our borders and which aid development in countries of origin.⁵
- Confronting racism as an obstacle to solidarity, examining our hearts, policies, and institutions.⁶
- Critiquing a culture that prioritizes accumulation of wealth over human dignity and integral development.⁷

As we seek to foster solidarity in hearts and policies, let us pray with Pope Francis: Lord, Father of our human family... Move us to create healthier societies and a more dignified world, a world without hunger, poverty, violence and war. Amen.⁸



Sandwich Ministry

Did you know that each month, St. Teresa's Outreach is committed to collecting over 1,000 bologna sandwiches to serve the homeless in downtown Columbus?

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS TO HELP BRING THIS IMPORTANT MINISTRY TO SAINT PETER CAMPUS!

Parishioners make bags of bologna and cheese sandwiches at home and drop off the sandwiches before Mass one weekend per month. Volunteers then deliver crates of sandwiches to St. Joseph Cathedral in downtown Columbus for distribution to the homeless.

Sandwich Making Instructions: If you would like to contribute sandwiches, follow the instructions below. <u>**Please follow this process exactly. Constructing the sandwiches in a different manner than what is listed here will make the sandwiches unusable.</u>

1. Acquire **2 loaves of bread**, **24 slices of RINDLESS bologna and 24 slices of WRAPPED American cheese.** You will also need to have **individual sandwich bags** handy. Save the large bread bag and twist tie – once in the sandwich bags, all the sandwiches will go back into the bread bag.

2. Take two pieces of bread and place them one on top of the other.

3. Place one **WRAPPED** slice of cheese on top of the two slices of bread.

4. Place one piece of bologna on top of the **WRAPPED** slice of cheese.

5. Begin to place each sandwich, two slices of bread on the bottom, one **WRAPPED** slice of cheese in the middle, and one slice of bologna on top, into an individual sandwich bag.

6. Place all the bagged sandwiches back into the bread bag, secure with the twist tie and bring them to Mass with you!


