

#### WHAT IS THE MUSIC MINISTRY'S ROLE IN PARISH?

The primary role of any parish music ministry is to enhance and beautify the Liturgy of the Holy Mass. The ministry works to help provide and lead quality music at Mass as well as help to bring all those attending into a closer relationship with our Lord. In addition to supporting liturgies and other faith centered events, the music ministry provides a place for individuals to develop their own faith through using their talents in service to the parish. We work to be a welcoming and familial community group for members in which they can belong, pray, and share their spiritual blessings and challenges with each other.

#### WHAT OPPORTUNITIES CURRENTLY EXIST FOR PARISHIONERS IN THE SPSJOA MUSIC MINISTRY?

No matter your amount of musical training or experience, all parishioners can find a home in the Music Ministry! We currently have one large adult English SPSJOA choir that regularly sings Sunday mornings, alternating every other week between campuses. Between both campuses, we have 17 cantors that help lead Sunday English Masses. In addition to choir members and vocalists, we have 4 main accompanists as well as wind instrumentalists from our parish that play before Mass and/or assist at special Masses. Outside of providing music for Mass, the Music Ministry likes to collaborate with the SPSJOA Homebound Ministry and arrange outreach events where volunteers go and sing hymns at various local nursing homes in the area.

At SPSJOA we are abundantly blessed to have a very active Spanish section of the music ministry. The Hispanic Choir provides music at all Sunday and weekday Spanish Masses in addition to assisting with special masses, bilingual Masses, weddings, quinceañeras, and funerals. The Spanish music ministry also serves the Diocese of Columbus by recording Masses in Spanish twice a month, which are broadcast on La Mega 103.1 FM radio every Sunday at 10 am. And finally, 2024 was the first year that the San Pedro Folk Dance Ensemble begin visiting and providing entertainment in nursing homes. To quote the leader for the Spanish music ministry, Gloria Cardenas, "I feel very lucky that now we are more united than before, language is not an impediment to doing great things for the glory of God."

#### GOALS FOR THE FUTURE OF OUR MUSIC MINISTRY

It is the music ministry's hope over the coming year to educate not only our members involved in the ministry, but also our congregation about the role of music in the liturgy, in our parish, and in our own personal prayer lives. We hope to continue to grow the ministry with more parishioner involvement, an additional ensemble(s), and more performance opportunities both liturgically and within parish events. The English and the Spanish music groups have really enjoyed getting to make music with

each, and we hope to find more ways to work together and collaborate. The music ministry also wants to pay special intention to involving more of our youth in the ministry, with tentative plans to form a children's choir in 2025. Finally, we desire to strengthen our presence in the diocese and in our community by continuing our Homebound Singing, collaborating with other musicians in the diocese, and finding new opportunities for involvement and outreach.

## Tesus, I Trust in You

#### MARY, YOU ARE MY STRENGTH

#### **Parishioner Testimony: Beverley Wynne**



I was born into a strong Catholic family in Hamilton, Ontario Canada. My mother instilled in me the necessity to always listen to, and follow the teachings of the church. I attended Mass regularly and relied on Mother Mary in times of hope and sadness.

This upbringing prepared me for life, which we all know is full of joy and sorrow. I felt that God was always at my side although I did get angry with Him once or twice. How selfish we can be when we don't get what we want!

I moved to Columbus from Chicago, IL, in 1987 where I think my faith life really began. I left behind a failed marriage, without any children, and was finally ready to listen to God. What did He want me to do? The answer I heard "Help those less fortunate than you."

I contacted the Facility for Child Abuse and was paired with a single mother and her two daughters aged 7 and 9, who had been sexually abused by their mother's boyfriend. Until the girls married we enjoyed picnics, miniature golf, reading at the library, pizza, on a weekly basis as well an occasional theater production. They were so excited to see The Nut Cracker and be introduced to classical music. They now have children of their own and I see them a few times a year. I hope their lives have been made better by my caring for them.

In the late 1980s, during my working career, I was blessed to conduct clinical trials with a new drug to treat people with AIDS. Getting to know those patients and doctors with that terrible disease was heart wrenching. Kindness as well as therapy was so important. Fortunately, now there is therapy to treat that devastating disease.

What about my church activities? I served on the Executive Committee for 2 terms, have been a lector since 1987, was an Extraordinary Minister, prepared meals for a Homeless Center and was on the Adult Enrichment Committee for 15 years. The Committee was involved in many faith-based activities, but one of the most significant things we did was the initiation of Eucharistic Adoration. I also helped in other capacities as needed. I felt that St. Peter parish was my second home.

For eight years after retirement, I tutored students studying for their GED certificate at St John's Learning Center, served on their Board and helped raise funds for various activities. Later I taught English as a Second Language to adults. Both of these activities were enriching experiences.

Recently, I contracted a serious disease which has a 1-3 month life expectancy if there is no response to treatment. Fortunately, I did respond after many complications and a 5 month hospital and nursing care stay. I kept repeating "Jesus I trust in You." I'm now recovering at home and I know God has a plan for me. I just have to listen.

### ABIDE IN ME, AND I IN YOU

- JOHN 15: 4

#### Parishioner Testimony: Andrew O'Rielley

Hello, my name is Andrew O'Rielley. You may recognize me as one of the young men serving on the altar during our 10 a.m. Mass most Sundays at the St. Joan of Arc Campus. Today, I am grateful for the opportunity to share a bit about my faith journey and the profound role our parish community has played in shaping my relationship with Christ here at St. Peter St. Joan of Arc Parish. For me, this journey is best understood through one of our Parish Pillars: Communion. St. Peter St. Joan of Arc Parish defines this pillar as "We Strive to Abide in Christ Through Prayer and Sacrament."

In the Christian life, the call to "abide in Christ" is a powerful invitation to live continuously in the presence of God, drawing strength, purpose, and grace from our relationship with Him. Rooted in the words of Jesus, "Abide in me, and I in you" (John 15:4), this invitation is not just a suggestion but an essential part of the Christian journey. Abiding in Christ requires intentional and ongoing engagement with Him, made possible through the practices of prayer and the sacraments. This is one of the reasons I love to serve on the altar each Sunday. It holds me accountable to this testimony. I also get the pleasure of watching our congregation on each of your journeys from up there!

To abide in Christ is to remain close to Him, developing a deep, enduring relationship. Serving on the altar does this for me. It brings me closer to Him. In the Gospel of John, Jesus describes Himself as the vine and believers as the branches, explaining that just as a branch must remain connected to the vine for nourishment, we too must stay connected to Christ to grow and bear spiritual fruit. Abiding in Christ is a commitment to live within the presence and will of God, seeking a life transformed by His love and truth.



This is why Mass is such an imperative part of my life. I couldn't imagine celebrating Mass without being on the altar and witnessing first-hand His consecration and what a wonderful place to recall His sacrifice and accept His precious gift of self.

Prayer is a cornerstone of the Christian faith and a primary way in which believers abide in Christ. Through prayer, we open ourselves to the presence of God, allowing Him to speak to our hearts, guide our actions, and shape our lives. Prayer is more than a means of asking for what we need; it is a conversation with God, in which we listen, reflect, and align ourselves with His will. Although I believe prayer should be something we do all day long without ceasing, where better to engage in prayer than before the Blessed Sacrament in Mass. As Christ says in Matthew 18:20, For where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them. This is why Mass is so important to get to. Our Lord wants us to pray in groups, not only alone. He can do so much more through a community of prayer! I enjoy praying with you.

In addition to prayer, the sacraments play a fundamental role in helping believers abide in Christ. We are blessed to have these Sacraments in our Catholic faith. Sacraments are visible signs of invisible grace, instituted by Christ to impart God's love and forgiveness. Through the sacraments, believers receive God's grace in tangible, profound ways, strengthening their faith and uniting them with Christ. The Eucharist, in particular, is central to this abiding relationship. In receiving the Eucharist, believers partake in the body and blood of Christ, uniting themselves physically and spiritually with Him. Jesus said, "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him" (John 6:56). The Eucharist not only brings individuals closer to Christ but also fosters a sense of community, as the faithful come together in communion to celebrate and share in the sacrificial love of Christ. Reconciliation is another sacrament that reinforces our abiding relationship with Christ. Through confession and absolution, believers are invited to seek forgiveness for their sins, allowing them to renew their commitment to live according to God's will. As each of us are healed, the Catholic Church becomes a better place to learn of God's love for us, his children.

As a community, it is a huge responsibility to care for those who are less fortunate than us and sometimes the weight of that responsibility can seem daunting. How as members of the Saint Peter Saint Joan of Arc Parish do we decide who or what is most deserving of our resources? I've learned that sometimes you just have to jump headfirst!

I began my service to STO through the Giving Tree. My family and I simply selected ornaments off the tree and bought presents for children who deserved a special holiday. From there I decided to volunteer to help sort and organize the gifts for recipient organizations. I loved helping with the Giving Tree and seeing the generosity of the Parish. When the opportunity came to serve as the Giving Tree chairperson it was a simple decision. I enjoyed how my then young children got excited to help me organize the gifts and watch other parishioners happily give of their resources.

Since the Giving Tree is part of the STO umbrella I began attending STO leadership meetings. I knew very little about the inner workings of STO.





I was impressed to learn about everything that this organization was responsible for - picking up bread from restaurants and grocery stores, feeding the homeless, tending to Anthony's Garden, making bologna sandwiches, washing windows at nursing homes, helping individuals with rent/utility assistance and the list goes on and on. The best part in learning about STO is that every single person is a volunteer! STO is comprised of parishioners who jumped in headfirst to give of their time and talents. Once involved these parishioners realized that the benefits of giving far outweighed standing on the sidelines!

STO recently hosted an Open Community meeting and it was so exciting to see parishioners of all ages coming together to make bologna sandwiches. There were parents who brought their young children and encouraged them that you can do something simple, like making a sandwich, to give back to those less fortunate. This event reminded me that it doesn't matter how your service journey begins it just matters that you start! I'm glad I started my journey years ago and invite each of you to give of your time and talents to help those less fortunate. Even the simplest gesture can have the biggest reward!





# Explanation of Financial Categories Revenue

- Offertory Includes all receipts for standard offertory, including online giving, envelopes and loose cash receipts.
- Bequests Includes special gifts, memorials, bequests and donations from any source including parish societies.
- Parish Activities Includes gross revenue from festivals, socials, raffles, bulletin advertising and all other general fund raisers.
- · Other Parish Income Includes receipts of interest, dividends and other types of income not covered in other accounts.
- Faith Formation Includes program fees, contributions, support from participating parishes, tuition and other income specifically applicable to religious education.

## Expenses

- Parish Admin & Operations Includes all salaries, Rectory expenses, office supplies, Church supplies (liturgy and music), employee benefits, utilities, maintenance repairs and insurance.
- Missionary Discipleship Includes the Bereavement, Respect Life, Walk for Life, English Language Learners (ELL), Anthony's Garden, Golden Classics, Quilters and Surviving Divorce Ministries.
- Charities Includes all parish charitable and civic projects, either for individuals or for organized groups. St. Teresa's Outreach Income and Expense is not presented.
- Diocese Support Includes a 8% assessment on all income of the parish (other than religious education fees and Appeal overages), used to support diocesan programs and services.
- Taxes Includes real estate taxes paid on all or part of an owned property which does not qualify for total tax exemption.
- Faith Formation Includes all costs specifically applicable to religious education, such as supplies, stipends, subsidies, books, curriculum materials, seminars and speakers.
- **Depreciation** Includes recognition over time the cost of major capital projects, including repair and renovations.



I found myself in the best time of my life. My family and I were healthy, happy and one of our biggest dreams was about to come true. Little did I know that at the same time I was going to endure one of the toughest battles of my life. On a Saturday in April 2024 on my drive home, I received the news that my father had passed away. I was heartbroken, confused and angry, but at the same time I felt God's presence. I could not understand much that day, but if there was something I did know, it was that God's timing was perfect.



I had not seen my father since I was nine years old and I had only talked with him a few times between 2011 to 2012 - I'm not

sure why I ever stopped talking to him after that. My father had actually passed in February in Mexico City, and I was just now finding out. A lot had happened in my life that led to me not having a relationship with my father, but at this time I was able to understand a lot of it. I finally was able to understand that everything that had happened in my childhood was not my fault, that I was just a child and all I'm able to remember now is all the love he had for me. Even though my father's death was devastating, I understood it was God's will and I cannot even describe the strength He has given me.



My partner and I also joined a couple's group in 2022 and we have been able to grow our faith as a couple and grow as parents, there we also found a sense of community. Before this I had not practiced religion even though I grew up Catholic. At first going to Mass, couple's group, and overall getting close to the Church and God was hard for me. I thank my partner for being the one who encouraged me and helped me through this process.

Going to church slowly became easier, I was finally able to feel God's presence not only when I attended Mass, but in every single aspect of my life and it even became a necessity. I believe that in the past two years, when I decided to let God into my life, He had been preparing me to go through the death of my father with strength and faith.

I do not know how I would have reacted to my father's death if I had not been close to God and to St. Peter's. On that Saturday in April all I wanted to do was to get to St. Peter's, I did not go though - I did not have the strength to leave my bedroom - but I prayed for my father and for strength. Somehow, I did find the strength to go to Mass that following Sunday and I was able to feel God's presence. Although I was grieving, I knew that with God and with faith I could get through this painful time. Father Schalk was also there for me at this time, I cannot express how helpful talking to him was, but I will always be grateful that he was there for me when I needed him. I'm also immensely grateful for my partner who was at my side through this somber time of my life and because he was the one who helped me grow close to God in the first place.

Losing my father was not easy, I always thought I was going to see him again, but all I can do now is honor his memory. At the time in my life when my dreams were coming true, my life turned upside down. Looking back now I know that it was God's plan for me, dreams can come true, and we can be blessed during hard times. I felt at this time that I had to keep going, that I was strong enough and that He was with me every step of the way.



God has given me everything I need, strength, faith, a community, an amazing partner and four beautiful kids. When I first became a part of St. Peter's, I was lost, but now I know exactly why I'm a part of it - through St. Peter's I found God and He was there when I needed Him the most, but most importantly I know that He will always be there for me.
