

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Let me draw your attention to a powerful image that is used in this weekend's first reading and responsorial psalm. The prophet Jeremiah says that one who trusts in the Lord is like a tree planted beside the waters with roots that stretch to the stream. Likewise, Psalm 1 says that a person who delights in the law of the Lord is like a tree planted near a river.

The authors of these sacred texts knew well the conditions of the desert. They understood what it was like to live through long seasons of drought in ancient Israel. In that part of the world, trees are able to survive if they are near a source of water. With roots tapped into a stream, a tree stays green and continues to bear fruit even when there is no rain.

As Christians, we remain tapped into the living water that Jesus provides. He is the one who sustains us through difficult seasons with the power of His grace. When we abide in Him through prayer and the sacraments, we continue to bear the spiritual fruit of joy and perseverance. Trusting in Jesus is what keeps us refreshed in the dryness of life.

If you are enduring hardship in this season of your life, please remember that your faith gives you access to living water. You need not languish, even if you find yourself in the desert, because you are firmly planted near the River. Allow your soul to drink from the stream of Jesus' wounded side. There is found the strength to carry on.




